


Year 1 go up in Flames

Class one have been working hard on their Bright Lights Big City learning journey this half term. We have been learning about the Great Fire of London. We made houses like those in London in 1666. On Monday 30th of January we set fire to our houses to help us understand what it might have been like in London during the Great Fire. The children were very enthusiastic and lots of parents came to watch as well. We came up with lots of adjectives to describe our thoughts and feelings during the fire. Over the last couple of weeks the children have been working on writing diary entries as if they were a child during the fire. They produced some wonderful work using the adjectives they came up with and thesauruses to look up synonyms. These are on display outside Class 1











Next Terms Value is Service and how we can serve others as Jesus did.

Words relating to 'servant' and 'service' are central in Christian theology. Service is not offered to gain some advantage for ourselves. 'Going the extra mile' involves sacrifice, putting ourselves out for someone else's benefit.

Service is demonstrated at the March CE Primary when the younger children are paired with older children as reading buddies and Prefect Buddies, the older children are being 'of service' to the younger, offering support and encouragement as they learn to read. The Buddies programme empowers the children to be 'of service' to those children who find themselves alone on the playground or who have hurt themselves and need comfort.

Alongside Service goes Trust. The value of serving others is built on Trust and is essential to human life and lies at the heart of all relationships, trust in the abilities and integrity of others where everyone can be enriched. **Trust will be part of the summer terms focus.**
