Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been wonderful to welcome all the children back to school this week: so many have grown over the summer! A big welcome to our new reception children who have all been in since day one and have settled so well making new friends all around the school.

The sense of being trapped and defenceless in a small office quickly becomes real -- and when the animatronic characters jump out at you, you'll jump (and maybe scream). This makes the game much too intense for younger kids.
