### The Three Trees

This is a lovely story linked to Easter.

Here is a link your child can watch and I have also attached a typed version of the story. On the third page of the story there are some reading comprehension questions your child can have a go at answering.



Here are some lovely follow up ideas.

Write what each tree wanted to be and what they ended up as? How did it make their dreams come true in the end?



Make the three tree and what they became out of anything you may have at home.

Paint a coloured background and make a silhouette of the crosses or the trees. You could do this to make Easter cards to send to family or friends.



Design and create a Peace Garden. If you have small chicks, rabbits, eggs, flowers etc the children could also add these to the Peace Garden. Or alternatively create a Spring garden in a cup.



## Science

Life cycle of a butterfly. I have attached a video and a PowerPoint about the life cycle of a butterfly. The children can then create their own life cycle. There are lots of ways this could be done creatively or they could create a fact page explaining each part of the life cycle. There are lots of other life cycles of different minibeasts online that they could also have a go at.



## Maths

If you want to have a go at something a bit different for maths the children could have a go at these questions and draw them out.

There were lots of baby animals at the farm. Half of them were lambs. How many ways can you show this?

There were lots of baby animals at the farm.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of them were lambs. How many ways can you show this?

I have also attached a maths Easter themed booklet the children could work through.

The children could have a go at drawing and colouring a minibeast symmetrically.



They could create an Easter egg hunt for the family by drawing a map and writing instructions using the terms clockwise. Anti-clockwise, full turn, half turn, quarter turn.

## D&T

Have a go at making some Easter cakes with whatever ingredients you have in the house. They will need to do weighing and measuring to make them and after they could write the instructions about how to make them. You could even share these recipes the children have written round to give them a real purpose of their writing.

## PE

The children started creating some gymnastics sequences using different jumps and turns. They could create their own routine (maybe the garden) and you could film it and email it over. Alternatively they could make a dance based on how different minibeasts move.
