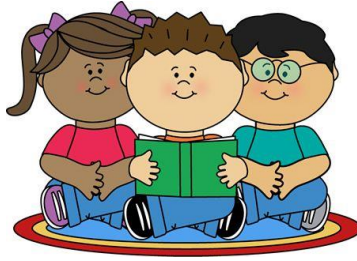

We aimed to prove you don't need puppy fur to have fabulous clothes- all being modelled next week in our fashion show - so watch this space !



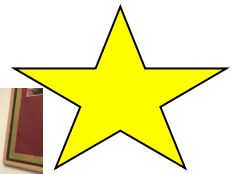
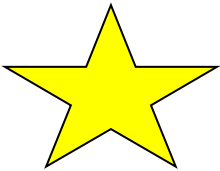
YR 5 Visit to the Mary Rose January 2019
